The LSH After School Program includes students from McCall, Donnelly, and New Meadows busing children from various schools to learn to ski, get some exercise outside, and provide a fun and safe kid's program for working families. The scholarship fund for the After School Program makes it possible for broad participation by reducing any financial barriers. Bear Basin Nordic Center and its miles of groomed trails offer kids and adults opportunities to stay active and Nordic ski and snowshoe. Our knowledgeable and friendly staff offer instruction for beginners and experts! Our Outback terrain park is growing as more kids and families are interested in jumps and rails.

Payette Lakes Ski Club is a non-profit 501(c)(3), and we sustain and grow our programs and improve our facilities because of gracious donors, volunteers, committed staff, our employees (say hello to the lift operators!), and our board of directors. We are currently in the middle of a Capital Campaign. So far this Campaign has successfully raised funds for installing the new t-bar, replacement and upgraded lighting on the Main Run and the Face, and new lighting on Race Run. This 2022-2023 winter, we will night ski on Race Run which offers more terrain and training opportunities for our local ski teams. 





The Payette Lakes Ski Patrol formed a new Nordic Patrol at Bear Basin Nordic Center last fall. This was our first season in operation and the new partnership resulted in a better understanding of how to perform day-to-day patrol functions, and also the realization that this is a needed service.

The ski patrol was present at the Nordic Center on winter weekends and holidays and intermittently out on the ski trails throughout the past season. Our goal is to provide a friendly interface with skiers and snowshoers, introducing newcomers to the area. Patrol members will provide route selection advice, assist with equipment, report on trail conditions, and help first-time Nordic skiers get going. Our plan is to follow this same service plan next winter, during the 2022/2023 season.

Patrollers are also trained to provide emergency first-aid care to any injured skiers or snowshoers. Next season we plan to add a dedicated emergency phone number for the area, with signs posted throughout the trail system to help guests access help quickly.

In our first season providing services, the Nordic Patrol responded to several emergencies, including a broken arm and a torn hamstring. Neither skier was able to self-evacuate back to their cars, so having a prompt response from the patrol meant avoiding spending extended time in the cold while waiting for rescue. With an on-site AED, toboggan, snowmobile, and trained patrollers on duty, this means we can act immediately in the case of an injury or medical incident at BBNC.

The Bear Basin Nordic Area is operated by the Payette Lakes Ski Club under a permit with the Payette National Forest. The area is supported with funding from the McCall Tourism Local Option Tax.

SPANISH-SPEAKING LESSONS AT LSH

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM GRADUATE AND CURRENT INSTRUCTOR, LILI DANIELS RECENTLY ORGANIZED AND TAUGHT SKI LESSONS IN SPANISH AT LITTLE SKI HILL DURING MARCH 2022.





"Ever since I was three years old, I would spend my winters skiing at Little Ski Hill. Every winter, my family and I would come to McCall, spend time skiing, and then head back to Argentina. When I was in Fourth grade, my family and I moved to McCall. I have been teaching skiing at Little Ski Hill since seventh grade, and I am now going into my Senior year of high school and excited for the next season. Last winter, after the six-week Little Ski Hill Program, I offered two weeks of free ski lessons in Spanish to seven students. Two students were first-time skiers, and the other five were beginner to intermediate. Throughout these two weeks, I saw a considerable improvement in all of the students, and the two first-time skiers even got up the T-bar and down the entire run. I had such a fun experience with these kids, teaching them to ski, practicing my Spanish, and seeing the smiles on their faces. This would not have been possible if it wasn't for Little Ski Hill's ability to let them ski for free, use gear, and support me through the two weeks.
